

**AUTHORIZING THE LOCAL CHIEF EXECUTIVE OF SANTIAGO CITY
TO PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO VICTIMS OF SUPER TYPHOON
“YOLANDA” (INTERNATIONAL CODE NAME: HAIYAN)
AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**



WHEREAS, Super Typhoon “Yolanda” made six (6) landfalls in the Philippines on November 8, 2013 (Friday morning) bringing heavy rains and winds; first in Guiuan, Eastern Samar; the second one is in Tolosa, Leyte; third and fourth landfalls in Cebu Province, in Daang Bantayan and Bantayan Island, respectively; fifth is recorded in Concepcion, Iloilo; and the 6th and last landfall is in Palawan;

WHEREAS, as of Nov 18, 2013, the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) reported 3,976 deaths, 18,175 injured and 1,598 missing; affected population has reached 2,212,955 families or 10,306,318 persons in 10,365 barangays in 44 provinces in 9 regions; and there are 850,058 families (4,008,894 individuals) who were displaced and are being served both inside and outside evacuation centers;

WHEREAS, as of Nov 18, 2013, the total cost of damage has been pegged at P11.6 Billion - P10.3 Billion worth of damage to agriculture; P1.3 Billion worth of damage to infrastructure; damaged houses increased to 571,806 with 288,922 totally damaged and 282,884 partially damaged;

WHEREAS, due to these paramount figure of damages, continuing efforts are being made by various individuals and organizations worldwide to raise and provide all kinds of assistance to the victims of Super Typhoon “Yolanda”;

WHEREAS, the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund (LDRRMF) may be used to provide assistance to other LGUs whose areas have been declared under a State of Calamity.


WHEREFORE, on motion of Coun. Celine Jeanne Abaya Siquian, unanimously seconded, be it –

RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, to authorize the Local Chief Executive of Santiago City to donate One Hundred Thousand Pesos (P100,000.00) as financial assistance to victims of Super Typhoon “Yolanda” (International Code Name: Haiyan) and for other purposes.

RESOLVED FINALLY, to furnish a copy of this resolution to Hon. Joseph Salvador Tan, City Mayor, Santiago City, for his information and appropriate action.
